Psalm 119:43

Psalm 119:43 (New International Version) Never take your word of truth from my mouth, for I have put my hope in your laws.

Psalm 119:43 (King James Version) And take not the word of truth utterly out of my mouth; for I have hoped in thy judgments.

We will:

1. Review the scripture
2. Review the scripture in Hebrew
3. Look at the validity of scripture

Words in Hebrew

Word means in Hebrew a word by implication a matter as spoken of thing adverbially a cause

Truth means in Hebrew stability, trustworthiness

Mouth means in Hebrew the mouth literally or figuratively particularly speech

Judgments means in Hebrew properly a verdict favorable or unfavorable, especially a sentence or formal decree

Psalm 119 41-48 WAW Meaning "W"

⁴¹ Let thy mercies come also unto me, O LORD, even thy salvation, according to thy word.

⁴² So shall I have wherewith to answer him that reproacheth me: for I trust in thy word.

⁴³ And take not the word of truth utterly out of my mouth; for I have hoped in thy judgments.

⁴⁴ So shall I keep thy law continually for ever and ever.

⁴⁵ And I will walk at liberty: for I seek thy precepts.

⁴⁶ I will speak of thy testimonies also before kings and will not be ashamed.

⁴⁷ And I will delight myself in thy commandments, which I have loved.

⁴⁸ My hands also will I lift up unto thy commandments, which I have loved; and I will meditate in thy statutes.

Psalm 119 is considered a chapter of instructions with possible multiple writers. But we know that even though Psalm 119 had multiple writers perhaps – the words spoken are from the mouth of God and how these collections of nobility and inner sanctum.

The writer of Psalm 119: 41-48 is a prayer. A personal experience. A prayer that shares with us how the writer felt about God's word.

The word has been proven to the writer. The writer vowed to the Lord, that the word will stand strong within.

The words the writer speaks about are the truth and makes a request unto the Lord to NOT have His words leave Him, because He understands that the words coming out of His mouth will be judged, and the decision the Lord makes of the words coming out of His lips will be testimonies, give liberty, bring delight and bring a lifting up.

What can we take away from Psalm 119:42?

The person to whom wrote this particular section is talking with the Lord. Expressing to the Lord his uttermost dedication to His words. How the Lord's words are powerful, and truth.

We have a choice in life, to either believe in the word of God or not. It's that simple. God uses His love. You see, without love there is no faith. These words of the Lord, we must first love Him to have faith to believe. The words must come alive in your heart and soul in order to believe these words are truth.

Therefore, we hear and can picture the heart of this individual. The Lord allowed these words to touch us in a way that will change our hearts as the Lord's words changed the heart and soul of this man; the author of Psalm 119:41-48.

And how will you do that? 5) are you willing to share your testimony with others, those that can be changed by your walk in the Lord's precepts? And How verse 46 6) How will you delight yourself in the Lord's words verse 47? 7) Will you decide to praise the Lord and mediate on His words, so it changes you and how verse 48?


